This Christmas, help families break the cycle of poverty

The powerful story of Elijah and the widow at Zarephath, in 1 Kings 17, displays God's miraculous provision. Despite having only a handful of flour and a little oil, the widow trusted God's promise, shared what she had, and she and Elijah were provided for. The widow and her son were also sustained throughout the drought. God wants to provide out of his abundance, even when our gifts are scarce.

This Christmas, our Tearfund church resource highlights the hope that God brings when we share what we have, even if it feels small. When we give him the small things we hold in our hands, he takes them, multiplies them, and uses them for his glory. Families like Malich's and Agnes's, who faced the worst drought in Kenya in over 40 years, know this first hand.

Communities cannot continue to be trapped by the extremes of climate change and by poverty.

When the severe drought began in 2019 and local water sources dried up, Malich's life changed drastically. She lost everything. All her family's livestock died. They had already been battling poverty, but with no livestock left and hunger a constant threat, they ended up relying on wild fruit just to survive.

Agnes, a mother in the same region, faced similar hardships in caring for her family as her community grappled with the same desperate challenges. Her family of seven had to survive on just one meal of tea and maize a day.

The drought took away more than just livestock; it stole hope and stability. But, we believe in a world where families can rebuild, thrive, and break free from the grip of poverty.





Unleashing hope through church-led poverty solutions

When your church gives to Tearfund, it funds innovative, community-focused programmes that empower families to overcome poverty. Through our local church partners, we provide people with sustainable solutions like training in poultry farming and climate-resistant crops. This approach helps communities tap into their skills and resources, fostering hope and resilience.

Tearfund's programmes not only bring immediate relief but also equip families to build brighter futures.

When we give back to God, he is able to multiply our efforts in ways we cannot imagine. As we invest in these communities, we can witness whole lives transformed.

Malich's and Agnes's stories:

A community member from Funan, where Malich lives, explains: 'During the drought we lost our sources of livelihoods. We lost all our livestock.'

Malich's family used to rely on livestock for survival, but continuous cycles of droughts and floods mean that is no longer possible for them. Animals have died, wells have run dry, and temperatures are soaring.

'When the rains came, water and pasture returned. We tried planting crops, but the rains stopped when the crops were at the flowering stage, and they failed.'

With no livestock left, Malich's family relies on wild fruits to survive, often walking 60 kilometres to gather them. 'We are surviving on these wild fruits, but it's still not enough. We are still facing hunger challenges. **Please come back and support us again.'**

Mother-of-seven, Agnes, also faced similar struggles of food insecurity in her community. 'The drought has really affected us,' she shares. 'We used to receive food aid, and it was very helpful. Now, we can only afford to feed our children a little maize.'

'I hope for continued aid to keep us going as we pray for rain which would bring back livestock and a chance to survive.'

Just as the widow at Zarephath trusted in God's provision, both of these women also place their faith in his promise to sustain their families through these tough times.

Partner with purpose and tackle poverty together

The struggles Malich and Agnes face continue, but by supporting families like theirs, we can provide the help they need to rebuild their lives and find hope in the face of adversity.

Tearfund is committed to working alongside local churches to bring sustainable solutions to communities like those in Kenya affected by the drought.
